SUMMARY



Implemetation of Social Employement Fund Programme

Since being appointed to implement **SEF** Round 3, Thembalethu Development has actively advancing been initiatives across Western Cape, Eastern Cape, and Gauteng. With reduced budget and job allocation from 3,000 to 2,500 due to national budget constraints. the organization strategically exiting participants who had served more than 160 days in SEF rounds 1 As of July onboarding and contract signing were the primary focus, while participants began work activities provinces. across the This effective of management allowed resources has Thembalethu Development maintain a robust support system for participants while navigating fiscal challenges.

The SEF programme's core initiatives—education support, food security, health care, support waste management, and micro-enterprise—continued to empower local communities by providing sustainable resources, building skills, and supporting vulnerable populations.

These past few months, partnerships GreenShoots and Help2Read strengthened educational support, with specific efforts in mathematics and literacy, reaching diverse age groups and promoting lifelong learning. Food gardens and feeding schemes bolstered community nutrition, directly benefiting over 1,500 families. Micro-enterprise efforts promoted entrepreneurial skills amona participants, encouraging self-sufficiency. innovation and Challenges, such as weather impacting gardens, underscored importance of adapting to environmental and economic conditions. The implementation drought-resistant of crops is one strategy being explored to enhance resilience. Looking Thembalethu Development plans to consolidate its social impact by fostering sustainable practices and expanding outreach through its local partners, aiming to engage more communities in future initiatives.









MILESTONES





PARTICIPANT ENGAGEMENT

Onboarded more than 2,500 participants engaging in various work-for-commongood activities, contributing positively to community development, including health and care support, education support, food security and nutrition, micro-enterprise development, and environmental projects.

EDUCATIONAL IMPACT

Through partnerships, provided tutoring and reading programmes that engaged more than 270,000 learners across over 140 schools, facilitated by more than 700 participants, enhancing literacy rates significantly in the targeted areas.





FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION

Established and maintained over 100 food gardens across the three provinces, directly impacting school feeding programmes, ECD centers, and community kitchens, helping to alleviate local food insecurity.

COMMUNITY SAFETY

Ensured safe transit for children to and from schools through the Walking Bus initiative, benefiting over 2,442 children and ensuring increased school attendance while fostering community cohesion.





TRAINING PROGRAMME

A total of 145 participants have been trained in different areas of focus including micro-enterprise development, education support, early childhood development and health care, 42 of which received their Grade E,D & C Security training.

ENTERPRENEURSHIP AND IMPACTS

Over the past five months, 292 participants were supported and engaged in various entrepreneurship activities. During this period, entrepreneurs completed 3,623 piece jobs, generating an impressive income of R1,437,482 through their diverse work activities.





WASTE MANAGEMENT










Thembalethu Development's Waste Management initiative is instrumental in promoting a cleaner, more sustainable environment in rural and peri-urban communities. This programme employs SEF participants in recycling cleaning efforts across schools, ECD centers, and public spaces, aiming to foster a culture of environmental stewardship. Key activities this quarter included recycling of waste for income generation, organized clean-up drives that engaged over 300 community volunteers, awareness workshops on waste reduction. Community members expressed positive feedback, noting cleaner public spaces and increased awareness about waste disposal.

To build on these achievements, Thembalethu Development plans to expand on its waste segregation practices and promoting a sustainable approach to waste management. Challenges such as a lack of resources for advanced waste processing were identified, highlighting a need for further partnerships with recycling firms. Looking forward, Thembalethu Development aims to secure additional resources for waste management tools and collaborate with local authorities to enhance waste management infrastructure, including the establishment of community recycling points.







MICRO-ENTERPRISE









The micro-enterprise theme within SEF has shown promising results by equipping participants with entrepreneurial skills. This quarter, Thembalethu Development collaborated with local local small, medium and Micro Enterprises (SMMEs) to conduct training sessions, focusing on fundamental business skills, market analysis, and financial literacy. Participants engaged in workshops that emphasized identifying local market needs and creating sustainable, small-scale enterprises.

The impact is reflected in the development of small-scale projects that enable participants to generate supplemental income, from craft making to small agricultural ventures, with some participants reporting up to a 30% increase in household income. Feedback from participants has been overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing confidence in exploring new income-generating avenues. Moving forward, Thembalethu Development aims to build an incubation hub where aspiring entrepreneurs can refine their business ideas with continued guidance and support, despite limited resources. The organization remains committed to fostering sustainable entrepreneurship and economic resilience among SEF participants.





FOOD SECURITY AND NUTRITION









Addressing food insecurity in rural areas remains a core focus of Thembalethu Development's SEF initiative. In partnership with local schools, ECD centers, and community groups, Thembalethu Development established and maintained food gardens in 16 locations across the three provinces. These gardens produce a variety of crops, providing fresh vegetables and herbs to community feeding schemes, ECD centers, and soup kitchens. During this quarter of produce, 49 soup kitchens and over 50,000 people benefited, reducing dependency on external food sources. Additionally, nutrition workshops were conducted, educating participants about balanced diets and healthy

Locality partners, such as Daruul Uloom School and Knoflokskraal in the Western Cape province, play a critical role in sustaining these gardens. Thembalethu Development also provided hands-on training in sustainable farming techniques, equipping participants with the knowledge to replicate these practices at home. However, challenges such as adverse weather conditions impacted crop yields in some areas, necessitating alternative strategies like shade netting for climate resilience. Moving forward, Thembalethu Development is committed to expanding food garden initiatives and supporting small-scale farmers, ensuring long-term food security and improved nutrition for vulnerable communities. The focus will also include establishing partnerships with local markets to create reliable outlets for selling surplus produce, thus enhancing food access and economic opportunities for participants.





EDUCATION SUPPORT









Thembalethu Development's education support efforts are structured to address critical gaps in literacy, numeracy, and overall educational engagement. Through partnerships with GreenShoots and Help2Read in the Western Cape province, the organization provides robust solutions for enhancing learners' math and reading skills. GreenShoots' Integrated Maths Programme strengthens foundational math abilities, making abstract concepts more accessible to young students, while Help2Read's Reading Clubs encourage a culture of literacy by offering a supportive space for reading practice and development. This dual approach to math and literacy ensures that learners are not only prepared for academic progress but are also equipped with essential skills that will serve them throughout their lives.

Beyond academics, Thembalethu Development enriches the school environment by placing more than 300 teacher and school assistants in classrooms, creating a better student-teacher ratio and enabling more personalized instruction. They also support sports coaching, which promotes students' physical well-being and builds essential life skills such as teamwork and discipline. Initiatives like the 'walking bus' program provide students with safe, reliable routes to school, addressing attendance issues tied to unsafe commuting conditions. Additionally, food gardens and feeding schemes contribute to students' nutrition, ensuring they have the physical energy and health needed for effective learning. These combined efforts not only impact students but also empower teachers and schools, creating a more resilient educational ecosystem.



HEALTH CARE SUPPORT









In the healthcare sector, Thembalethu Development plays a pivotal role in expanding access to essential services and supporting health facilities with much-needed personnel. Through the Social Employment Fund (SEF) programme, Thembalethu Development has placed 181 participants in health facilities, where they perform various duties that supplement existing healthcare resources. This placement strategy helps to bridge critical gaps in patient care, especially in rural and underserved areas where healthcare providers are often stretched thin. The presence of these trained participants alleviates workloads for existing staff, enabling a more comprehensive and responsive approach to community health.

Moreover, Thembalethu Development addresses community health needs directly by conducting 1,226 home visits for elderly and vulnerable individuals who face mobility challenges. Through these visits, the organization provides healthcare services and essential support to those unable to access formal healthcare settings, ensuring that no community member is left unattended. Nurse assistants further reinforce this outreach by delivering basic medical support and caregiving services, particularly for elderly populations. By integrating facility support with home-based care and community health assistance, Thembalethu's healthcare initiatives promote a healthier community infrastructure and foster greater well-being among South Africa's most vulnerable populations.



COMMUNITY IMPACT





THE JOURNEY OF TITUS COMMUNITY ECD CENTRE

Thembalethu Development celebrates the success of Titus Community ECD Centre, which, under the leadership of Maria, a principal in Titus Community ECD Centre in the Western Cape province, transformed from a center facing compliance challenges to a fully registered facility. Through determination and collaboration, including support from our Social Employment Fund (SEF), the center upgraded its infrastructure, met national standards, and revived its community garden. This achievement secures ongoing funding from the Department of Basic Education, ensuring sustainable growth and highlighting the power of partnership and resilience in empowering ECD centers to make a lasting impact.

MOOKETSI'S JOURNEY TO BEAUTY THERAPY SUCCESS

Thembalethu Development's Micro Enterprise Development programme, through the Social Employment Fund (SEF), helps individuals like Mooketsi Mabuye, in Tembisa Gauteng province, achieve lasting change. Starting with a stipend, Mooketsi saved to become a beauty therapist, completing her training at Excell International Beauty Academy. She now runs a successful beauty therapy business and plans to open her own salon, creating job opportunities in her community. Mooketsi's journey highlights SEF's role in empowering individuals, fostering self-sufficiency, and driving community development.





NONDUMO'S PATH TO EMPOWERMENT

Nondumo Mbuntshu, from Tembisa, overcame financial and training barriers to launch her cell phone repair business, Dudu G Repairs and Tech Solution. Through the Social Employment Fund (SEF), she received a stipend to buy equipment and participated in New Venture Creation training, gaining skills in financial management, pricing, and marketing. Today, her thriving business serves as a beacon of hope, demonstrating how SEF's support can empower individuals to succeed and inspire others in their communities.

SERVICES SETA



The Services SETA Learnership Programme has officially commenced, marking a significant step in skills development and entrepreneurship training. Initially designed to offer the General Education and Training Certificate: Adult Basic Education and Training (SAQA ID 71751, LP 64309), the programme was later updated to the National Certificate: New Venture Creation (SMME). This qualification is registered at NQF Level 2 and carries 38 credits.

A total of 397 learners have been enrolled across 5 provinces to participate in this initiative.
